Since 2016, I have had the privilege of equipping Haggai leaders from over 100 countries to effectively demonstrate and present the Good News of Jesus Christ. These men and women are strategically positioned. But more than that, they are motivated by a deep love for the Lord and are wholly committed to the task of ending Gospel poverty.

These leaders arrive at our Haggai Leader Experience (HLE) from nations where Jesus is not known by many or not at all. Many, like me, grew up Gospel poor. Haggai leader Bua* is well-acquainted with Gospel poverty. As a non-governmental organization (NGO) leader and pastor in Southeast Asia, she has seen the depths of human brokenness and the hopelessness that comes when individuals and communities are deprived of the Good News of Jesus.

But Bua has not let the stark reality of Gospel poverty deter her. She has seen God overcome the darkness to bring redemption and transformation. She has learned the supreme value of living out Matthew 5:13-16, acting as salt and light in a place that desperately needs the Gospel.

Bua reminds us that we, as followers of Christ, are entrusted to live according to God's purposes. We are called to preserve

humanity from the decay of sin, as salt, and radiating Christ's light through our love and good works.

This faithful Haggai leader in Asia has beautifully modeled a life as salt and light. She knows Christ, continually putting her faith in Him. She grows in Him through prayer and the study of His Word. She humbly serves Him. And she shares His love — empowered by her equipping — with the Gospel poor.

She spends her days traveling from village to village, playing sports with local youth, and listening to heartbreaking stories of drug abuse, homelessness, and hunger. She acts as salt and light to those she meets, praying for their every need and telling them of God's love and saving power.

“Living as salt and light isn't merely a metaphorical concept but a tangible calling for believers,” Bua says, “By embracing this purpose and actively living out our faith, we illuminate the world with God's love and truth, offering hope and salvation to those around us.”

“Before Haggai, I was not interested in [sharing the Gospel]. But I have learned the importance of doing so as a Divine assignment. Sharing the Good News is a task and a responsibility, but also it is a privilege. God has taught me to love others more and to fear for their eternal fate.”

Adil is a Haggai leader strategically positioned in Morocco, a nation that lives largely in Gospel poverty. He sells plastic materials and kitchen utensils, treating his customers with respect and integrity. He is engaged in his community, helping those who are weary and destitute.

“With respect, balance, and acceptance of all of our differences, I earn the right to share the Gospel with them.”

His Kingdom impact, inspired by his Haggai Leader Experience, has multiplied through the use of social media. It all started with a small Facebook group, where he answered questions about Christianity. Most that he connected with belonged to the country’s majority religion and had never heard the Gospel.

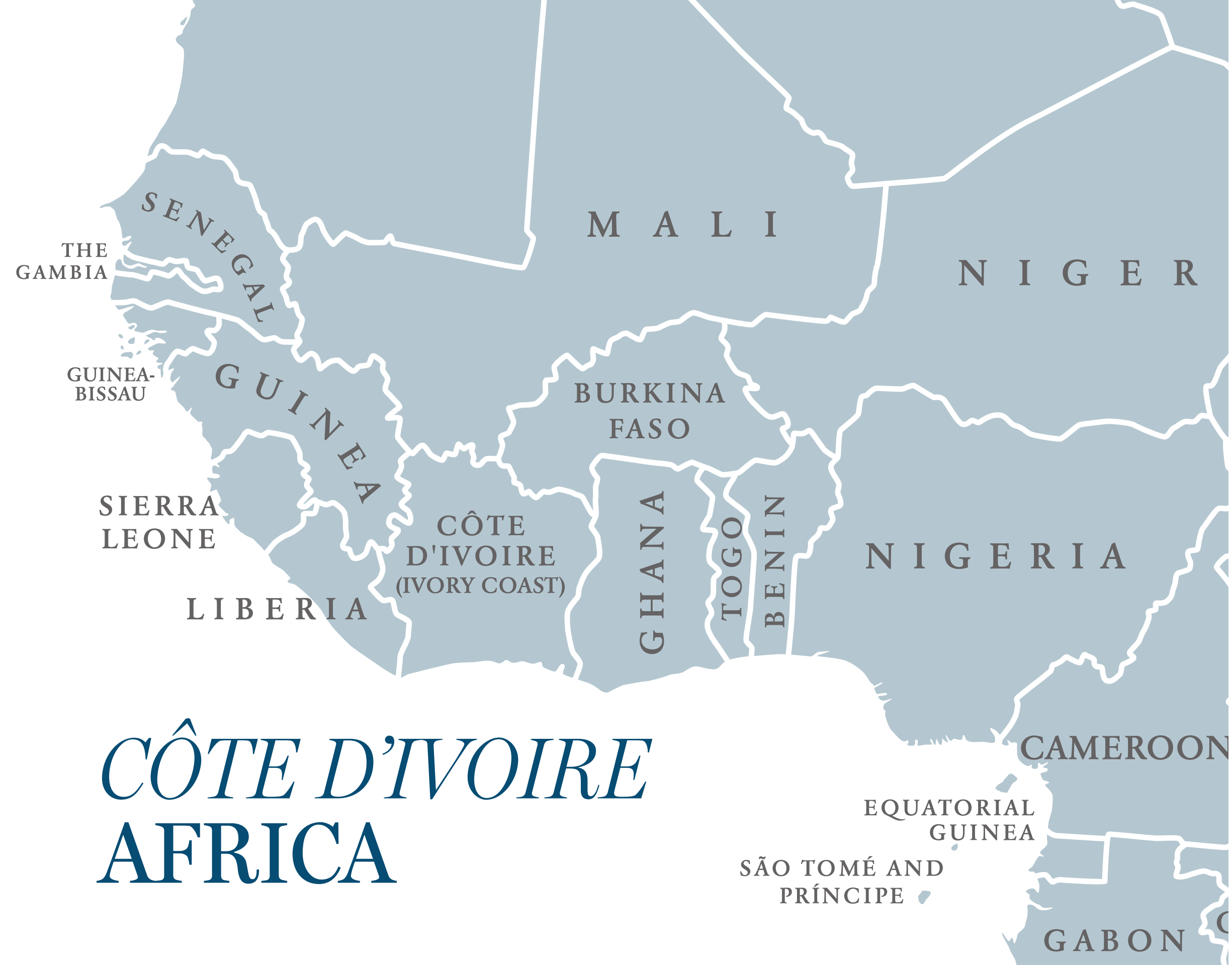
Five years later, Adil has led 80 people to the Lord through his Facebook page. Most have been baptized and continue to walk faithfully with Christ. He meets with 26 of them regularly, equipping them to effectively share the Gospel with those around them.

His ministry is urgent now, as he realized through the HLE that his people are living and dying without knowledge of Christ’s resurrection. And he, as an indigenous believer, can share with them best.

“I am equipping leaders to reach the largest number of people and to expand the circle of outreach, in order to reach the Gospel to the furthest places possible.”

Adil reminds us that God can use anything we do — our day jobs, our community engagement, our social media presence — to end Gospel poverty.

CÔTE D'IVOIRE AFRICA

Haggai leader Marie is strategically positioned in Western Africa, along the Ivory Coast in Côte d'Ivoire.

Her nation is a captivating place with lush forests, rich cultural heritage, and a diverse population. It has found prosperity as the world's leading producer of cocoa — an industry that employs over 25 percent of the country's population. Including Marie, who is the Director of Human Resources for a Belgian cocoa company.

Despite all of this, Côte d'Ivoire largely lives in Gospel poverty.

42 percent of the population adheres to Islam, while other Ivorians prescribe to atheism, animism, ancestor worship, Buddhism, and more. There is also a Christian population, which Marie is devoted to equipping.

Through her HLE, Marie learned how to demonstrate and present Christ in her workplace. And she has also discerned God's call on her life to reach Ivorian youth. With Gospel poverty on the rise in her nation, Marie has the unique opportunity to prepare the next generation of believers to build the Kingdom.

Through her local church, our Haggai leader has had countless opportunities to speak into the lives of children and teenagers. She models a life devoted to Christ before them and gives them space to ask questions, share hardships, and find authentic faith.

This is the impact of the Haggai Leader Experience. It changes the life of the leader who attends while having an inestimable impact on future generations. It changes the ways a leader engages in their workplace while opening doors to new populations in need of equipping.

He works an office job in Buenos Aires, where he shares the redemption and transformation that Christ provides around the water cooler. Before that, he served as a pastor, developing small groups where followers of Jesus were equipped to engage the culture with the richness of the Good News.

He has ongoing relationships with homeless people in his city, providing for their physical needs in tandem with sharing spiritual truths. He shares meals with them, celebrates holidays, and brings other believers along to do the same.

He’s written a book on spiritual formation, preached at conferences around the world, and served as a political leader in his community.

God has honored Max’s obedience, giving him countless opportunities to make a Kingdom impact and end Gospel poverty. But Max is aware that this impact doesn’t have to stop with him . . .
